A daycare program for children with minor illnesses located on the campus of Chandler Regional Medical Center

HOW CAN I USE THE PROGRAM?

Be prepared! Before your child becomes sick, call us to pre-register so we will have their information on file, including a complete medical history, immunization records and emergency contact information.

Our doors open at 6:30 a.m. and close at 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday (excluding holidays). Reservations are accepted 24 hours a day on a first-come, first-served basis. Place an initial call to reserve your space as soon as you know you may need us, then confirm your reservation with a second call between 6:40 and 7:40 a.m. The unit may close for the day if no reservations are made by 8:30 a.m. To make a reservation, we will need:

- : Your name and phone number
- : Brief description of child's illness
- : Child's name and date of birth
- : Hours child will be in Kid Care

COST

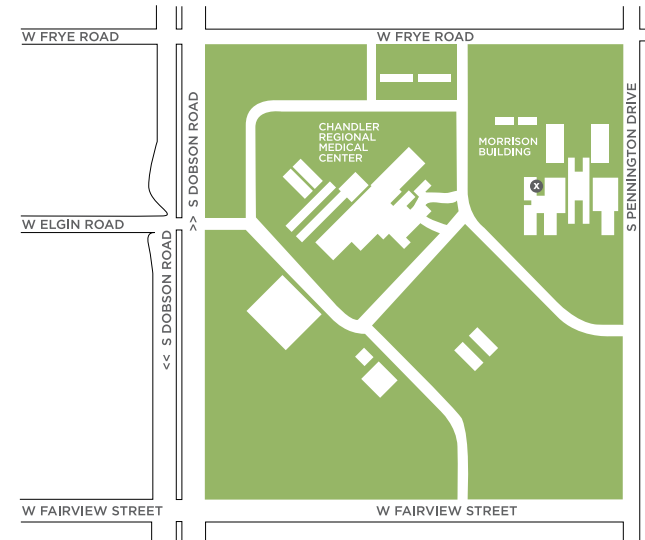
The cost for each child in our care is \$30 for six hours or less, and \$40 for more than six hours.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING?

- : **Food:** Chandler Kid Care provides kid-friendly, nutritious meals and snacks. If your child has food allergies or other nutritional needs, please provide food for the child.
- : **Comfort items:** Feel free to bring a toy or blanket to make your child feel more at home.
- : **Medications:** All medications must be provided by the parent/guardian in the original container marked with the child's name and dispensing instructions. A licensed nurse will give all medications.
- : **Incidentals:** Parents are responsible for providing bottles, formulas, diapers and a change of clothes.

SICK CHILDREN LEAVE YOU IN A BIND?

Chandler Kid Care Can Help!



AS A WORKING PARENT, HAVING A SICK CHILD CAN LEAVE BOTH YOU AND YOUR CHILD FEELING VULNERABLE.

Chandler Kid Care is a day care program for infants and children through age 12 who have minor illnesses that prevent them from attending school or regular day care. Certified nursing assistants with pediatric training care for the children so that parents can go to work with peace of mind knowing their children are in a nurturing, caring environment under the management of a registered nurse.

WHO CAN ATTEND CHANDLER KID CARE?

Chandler Kid Care is generally available to parents with children from infant through age 12, including special needs children, with mild illness, including:

- : Flu-like symptoms such as increased temperature, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea (but who have not been diagnosed with the flu by a blood test)
- : Strep throat if they are eight years old (and can be in an isolation room) or have been treated with antibiotics for 24 hours. For those seven years old and younger, treatment with antibiotics for 24 hours is necessary.
- : Conjunctivitis/pink eye but without pus discharge or fever
- : Mild upper respiratory infections such as fever and mild symptoms like cold, sore throat, croup and/or ear infection
- : Fifth disease or "slapped cheek" infection
- : HIV if cleared by a physician
- : Shingles and herpes simplex
- : Contagious illnesses requiring isolation for children over age eight, depending on the incubation period and the availability of the isolation area

WHO MAY NOT ATTEND?

Children may not attend the program if an illness requires a higher level of care than the staff can provide, or if other conditions are not met, including:

- : A fever of 102 degrees or greater, unless seen by a physician
- : Strep throat before 24 hours of antibiotic treatment
- : Mucus discharge from conjunctivitis (eyes) unless child has received two consecutive doses of antibiotic eye drops over a six-hour period
- : Undiagnosed rash
- : Impetigo
- : Hand, foot and mouth disease
- : RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) and children who require nebulizer or breathing treatments
- : Fever with a stiff neck, lethargy, irritability or persistent crying
- : Diarrhea (three or more loose stools in an eight-hour period)
- : Signs of dehydration: dry or sticky mouth, low or no urine output, not producing tears, sunken eyes, markedly sunken soft spot in an infant, fatigue
- : Blood or mucus in the stools
- : Vomiting three or more times
- : Contagious stages of illnesses including pertussis (whooping cough), measles, mumps, chicken pox, rubella or diphtheria
